WITNESSETH: That said parties of the first part, in consideration of the covenants and agreements hereinafter mentioned and mutually agreed upon by all parties to be kept, done and performed, do hereby lease for the period of Until surrendered to the said part Y of the second part _____ Union Store Card _____, the property of and issued by THE RETAIL CLERKS' INTERNATIONAL PROTECTIVE ASSOCIATION.

Part _____ of the second part agree _____ to retain in _____ employ only members, or those if eligible, who will become members within thirty days from the date of their employment, of Local No. 964 RETAIL CLERKS' INTERNATIONAL PROTECTIVE ASSOCIATION.

Part Y of the second part agree is that his store, located at No. _____ in the City of _____ State of California shall close at the following time:

All day on Sunday; all day on the following Legal Holidays: New Years Day, Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day

at 12 o'clock noon on the following Legal Holidays: _____

at 6 P.M. o'clock on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays; at 6 P.M. o'clock on Saturdays. Parties of the first part agree to advise all Local Organizations of the City of Roseville and State of California of the action of the second part Y signing this agreement, and

IT IS FURTHER AGREED by all parties that the interests of each shall be mutually taken care of and advanced, and that any violation of the foregoing stipulations shall be sufficient cause for surrender of the Union Store Card.
